A period of realizing carried prices 20 to 25 points lower. Good support developed on the decline however and the into-sight figures for the week which were about 8.000 below last year's, combined with a general conviction that the selling had been overdone, caused a heavy movement which virtually restored last night's closing level. While it is admitted that the frosts as a whole have done but little damage, it is nevertheless argued that this was due to the fact that there is little or no top crop to kill. Low crop ideas are still prevalent and in buildish circles the feeling persists that the upward movement will be resumed more vigorously than ever when the big buil speculators believe the time is ripe. We still think it risky to sell cotton except on very sharp bulges.
