

THAT TEN MILLION LOAN FOR BRITISH COLUMBIA

Victoria, B. C., Feb. 15.—A bill was introduced into the House by Hon. Price Ellison Friday night to provide for the province borrowing ten million dollars in order to pay off overdrafts and meet treasury bills of three hundred and ten thousand pounds, as well as to provide for expenditures under revenue account. The loan is to bear interest at 4 1/2 per cent, and its life to be 37 years.

SEEKS RAIL LINES FROM BOGOTA TO CARIBBEAN AND PACIFIC

TRAIN ON THE COLOMBIAN NATIONAL RAILWAY

For its progress and material development Colombia's first and greatest need, according to its men of broad vision, is railroad communication between Bogota, the capital of the republic, and the ports on the Caribbean Sea and the Pacific Ocean.

Under the most favorable conditions today the journey from Barranquilla, on the Magdalena River near the Caribbean, to Bogota consumes about ten days. Two Magdalena River boats and three railroads have to be used in making the trip. For the Buenaventura port on the Pacific even a longer time is required. Much of the way is covered on muleback or horseback.

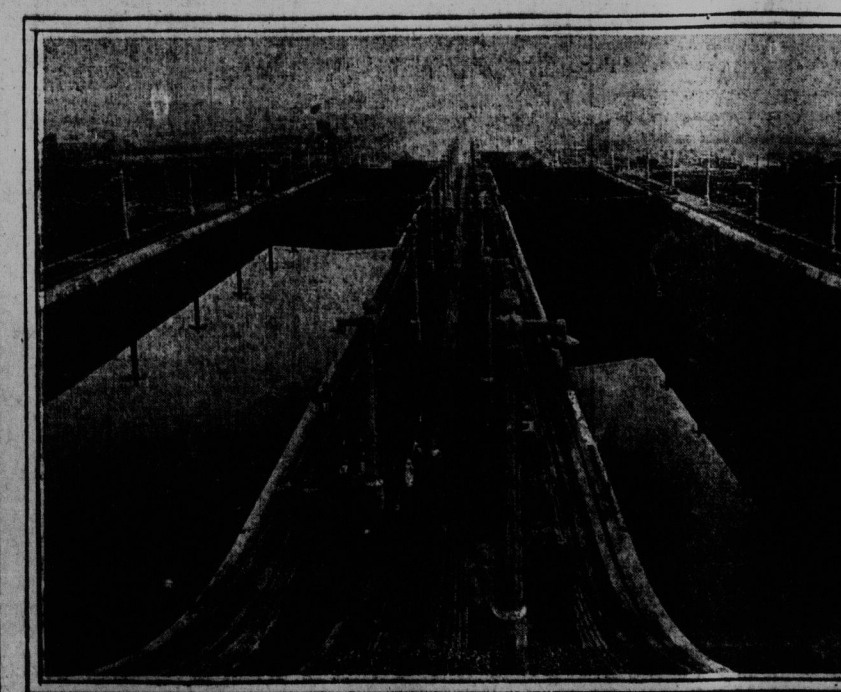
It is admitted by the statesmen and economists of Colombia that a railroad line which would enable the carrying of passengers and freight from Bogota to Barranquilla or Santa Marta in thirty-six to forty-eight hours would revolutionize the life and trade of the nation.

JUDSON & CO'S COTTON LETTER

New York, Feb. 14.—The unfavorable cables this morning were offset as an influence by the supply and distribution figures, which showed a record break in domestic mill consumption for the month of January. This exhibit was somewhat surprising to many traders who had expected that consumption would fall behind last year. Domestic mill consumption for the first five months of the season totaled 2,516,000 bales as against 2,402,000 for the same period last year. Weakness in realizing checked the opening advance but despite the small attendance and impaired wire service as the result of a severe snowstorm, there was a good demand for contracts. Trade buying was in evidence and commission houses as a whole seemed to be more favorably disposed toward the market.
