Spencer's Island Launching.
Special to The Standard.
Parabore, April 15.—The Minas Princess, a tern schooner of 465 tons register, was launched this afternoon by the Fowler Head Shipping Company, from their shipyard at Spencer's Island. The new vessel is classed twelve years in bureau veritas, has all the latest improvements, is first class in every particular and is expected to be a fast seller and a large carrier. She has been purchased by J. Newton Pugsley of Parabore, and will be commanded by Captain L. C. Towner of Sackville, N. B. She will arrive at this port next tide, and will probably deal deals for the United Kingdom.
The tern schooner Leonard C. has cleared for Eastport, where she will load for Boston.
The schooner Mayflower and Oranibar on route to Boston with cargoes of laths shipped by Burpee L. Tucker.

Makes Short Visit.
The S. S. Lady of Gaspe entered port yesterday afternoon from New York, carrying a full cargo of sugar. She discharged before eight and was expected to sail before morning for Halifax en route to Boston.
S. S. Grelstone Arrived.
The S. S. Grelstone arrived yesterday from Gibraltar via Halifax and will load a full cargo of grain. She is assigned to J. T. Knight and Co.
Three Vessels Due at Halifax.
The S. S. Olympic is expected at Halifax this morning with a large military passenger list. Tomorrow the S. S. Carmania is due at the sister port and Friday morning sees the arrival of the monster liner Aquitania, all carrying soldiers.

First Vessel from St. Lawrence.
Halifax, April 15.—The steamer Lequancy, Captain A. Dunn, arrived here early this morning from Quebec for New York and anchored in the stream. She is the first vessel to arrive here this season from the St. Lawrence.
Had Large Cargo of Sugar.
The R. M. S. P. Chaudiere, which arrived at this port yesterday after a three-day trip from Bermuda, had a cargo of 200,000 pounds of raw sugar and 500 barrels of molasses. The passenger list was made up mostly of tourists but there were some Imperial troops returning from garrison duty in the West Indies.
S. S. Aracine at Halifax.
The S. S. Aracine, 2475 tons, which has been expected at this port for some weeks, arrived Monday at Halifax from Portland, Maine. She will call some time this week for Paimouth. Capt. Sergeant is her master.
First Steamer for Quebec.
The first ocean freight steamer to leave Halifax for Quebec is the S. S. Queen Elizabeth, 4235, which arrived at the sister city Monday afternoon from Gibraltar. The Imperial oil tanker, S. S. Sarnotte, sailed from Halifax yesterday for Montreal, being the first vessel to leave for that port this year.
Returned with Empty Hops.
Sydney, April 12.—After spending a month in the Gulf in search of seals, the steamer Inverness, Captain Pettie, has returned to North Sydney with empty holds.
Lightship Will be Replaced.
It is expected that the lightship Halifax will soon take her place at the entrance to the harbor. She has been off duty longer this year, owing to having been on fire.
