

EVENING SESSION.

7.30 p.m.

A large and interested audience gathered in McDougall Hall, Mrs. S. W. Foster, Vice-President, presiding. The opening hymn, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name," was sung. Mrs. Foster read the 145th Psalm, and the Rev. D. W. Morison led in prayer.
