Gleanings From the M. O. League

PRESIDENT JACKSON'S PLANS SANCTIONED

President Jackson of the Michigan-Ontario circuit is in receipt of official sanction of his plans for settlement of territorial claims along the lines suggested at the meeting held in May City a fortnight ago and in the same mail also came formal notice of disputes regarding ownership of half a dozen players. In the eyes of the executive head of the league this opening of arguments regarding eligibility of players is the best indication in the world that the new league will be a success. "Until a league gets to fighting it isn't in trim" declares Jackson.

It is probable a meeting of the league directors will be held in May City. It is probable a meeting of the league owners and managers will be called to meet here on Sunday but on this point the president will make final decision to-morrow. All that has kept the call for the meeting back until now is waiting for official notice on the Bay City proposition and getting returns from the various cities in population figures necessary to assure the Class B. rating. This now has all been decided and telegraphic calls for the meeting will be sent out to-morrow if it is decided to assemble in Detroit on Sunday. A meeting on that day would give the visiting representatives an opportunity to see the American League game here.

LONDON'S AND BAY CITY'S DIFFICULTIES

A meeting of the Tecumseh Baseball Association, Limited directors was held yesterday and a lot of routine business was disposed of and it was decided to immediately take up the matter of the players, who are claimed as signed by the Bay City club who had previously accepted London terms, with President Jackson of the M-O League on advice from Secretary J.H. Farrell of the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues.

Secretary Rhodes of the club will be in Detroit in the interests of the London baseball situation. All the correspondence that passed between Manager Keenan and the players in question namely, Catcher Tree, Pitcher Watson and Infielder McGinnis will be presented to the league official, who has to do with the disposal of the cases of this kind when clubs of the same league are involved.

While in Detroit the London official will close with the fast Maxwell Baseball Club champions of Detroit for an exhibition at Tecumseh Park on Saturday May 10.

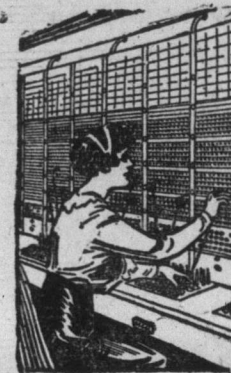
