The Honorable Mr. Benson, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill and had directed him to report the same to the House, without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Chapais, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny, it was Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day the House was adjourned during pleasure and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled : "An Act respecting the trial and putsish." "ment of Juvenile offenders."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Simpson, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with several amendments, which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive them.

Ordered, That the Report be now received, and

The said amendments being twice read, and the question of concurrence put on each, they were severally agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny, it was Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The guestion was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill to which they desire their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting the duties of "Justices of the Peace out of Sessions in relation to summary convictions and orders," was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny, it

Ordered, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the Whole House tomorrow.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, with a Bill intituled : "An Act to Incorporate the Dominion Mutual Life Guarantee Assurance Company," to which they desire the concurrence of this House.

The said Bill was read for a first time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Macpherson, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Allan, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a second time to-morrow.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, to return the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the Act 23 Victoria, Chapter 123, being an Act incorporating "the Corporation of Pilots for and below the Harbor of *Quebec.*"

Also, the Bill intituled : "An Act respecting offences against the person."

And also, the Bill intituled: "An Act to incorporate the Canadian and European Tele-"graph Company," and to acquaint this House that they have agreed to the amendments made by the Senate to the said Bills without any amendment.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny, The House adjourned.
