9 Vict.....12 and 10 & 11 Vict.....38	An Act to remedy certain defects in the Registration of Titles in the County of Hastings in Upper Canada. The period limited by these Acts for receiving memorials, &c., after being extended by 12 Vict. c. 97 is now extended by 16 Vict. c. 151, to.....	1st Jan. 1854. &c.
9 Vict.....28	An Act to repeal certain Laws therein mentioned, to provide for the better defence of the Province, and to regulate the Militia thereof. Section 31 (Quakers, Mennonists and Tunker's exemption) and so much of this Act as repeals 4 & 5 Vict. c. 2, repealed by 12 Vict. c. 88, as far as regards Upper Canada. It is also amended by 12 Vict. c. 89, as regards the annual muster of Militia in Upper Canada.—This Act is continued by 13 & 14 Vict. c. 11, to..... But the last mentioned Act provides that if there shall be a War between Her Majesty and the United States of America, at the time at which the Militia Act would otherwise expire, it shall not expire till the end of the Session next ensuing the Proclamation of Peace.	10th Augt. 1853 &c.

10 and 11 Vict.....1	An Act to enlarge the powers of the Trinity House of Montreal, in certain cases where the Public Health may be endangered.—This Act had expired on the 9th November, 1847, but was revived and continued temporarily by 11 Vict. c. 3, it is now continued by 16 Vict. c. 151, to.....	1st Jan. 1854, &c.
10 & 11 Vict.....20	An Act to amend, explain, and continue an Act passed in the seventh year of the Reign of Her Majesty, intituled, "An Act to prevent obstructions in Rivers " or Rivulets in Upper Canada."..... See 7 Vict. c. 36.
