V-Reds make AUA A Playoffs

Despite losing their final regular season game, the UNB Varsity Red's Women's Volleyball Team, have crept into the AUA A playoffs.

The playoffs, which take place this weekend at Mount Allison University, feature the Dalhousie Tigers, Saint Mary's Huskies, Moncton Anges Bleu as well as the V-Reds.

UNB (9-7), the two time defending champions, will face the unbeaten Tigers (16-0) in their semifinal, Saturday afternoon at 4pm. In the 2pm semi UdeM (12-4) faces SMU (12-4).

Going into, last Saturday's game against Moncton, the V-Reds were tied

with the Mount Allison Mounties for the fourth and final playoff spot,



although the V-Reds had already clinched the tie-breaker. Needing a win to control their own fate, the V-

Martin now leads the AUA A with an amazing 342 kills in the 16 regular season matches. A feat which may be unparalleled within the CIAU.
