The Hon. the Minister of Lands  
of the Indian reserve, Roberval,  
Lake St. John.

Dear Sir,

With reference to a lot  
that I bought on the Indian reserve  
five years ago, the first instalment  
was paid by Mr. L. P. Bilodeau, No.  
11 of range 5, Quinichouan township,  
of which I was the second purchaser  
by a deed under private seal, and  
after this deed was made out and  
signed by four or five witnesses,  
I paid all that was due the Govt.  
to the Agent, who was Mr. Donohue,  
and he told me that he had sent  
the papers to the Dept. in order that  
the lot might be put in my name,  
in fact that I should have the patent  
in my name; and I have not received  
any news since that time, and  
now I wish to know how much I  
have still to pay in order to obtain  
the patent, and whether I may have  
it in my name and whether the  
deed that I made is sufficient to give  
me my right as purchaser.
