- muda (20), and Halifax (17) and the Sydney (16)
 Sections of a Convoy left their assembly ports to
 effect junction at sea. The Bermuda Section, until
 junction with the Halifax Section was under the
 ocean escort of H.M.S. "ALAUNIA". The combined
 Convoy sailed under the ocean escort of H.M.S.
 "ASCANIA". The 53 ships consisted of 43 British,
 4 Dutch, 3 Norwegian, 1 Swedish, 1 Greek, and 1
 Roumanian. All ships were bound for the United
 Kingdom, with the exception of 1 vessel which was
 travelling to Eire. One of the British ships
 was forced to return to Halifax for repairs to its
 compass. 3.8.40.

- (iii) There were 13 independent trans-ocean sailings during the week, 7 from the Atlantic Coast and 6 from the Pacific Coast.
