Nor have the orphans been forgotten. The Sisters of Providence have erected a magnificent brick building at New Westminster, where they bestow the most devoted care upon the unfortunate little children bereaved of father and mother. Another benevolent institution which has done and is still doing good work is "The Monastery" under the direction of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity, in Vancouver. These self-sacrificing women are nobly following the example of the Good Shepherd in befriending and caring for girls and young women from different parts of the province.
