

The School

The school, which was opened as a day school only in March, 1898, has increased since its removal in 1901 to the present buildings, till it numbers on its books about 175 girls. It stands in large grounds at the corner of Nelson and Jervis Streets in the highest and healthiest position in the West End of the city, commanding a beautiful view of English Bay and the mountains. It has large, gravelled play grounds and a tennis lawn.

The buildings themselves are divided into the senior and junior schools and are planned with a special regard to ventilation and sanitation. The rooms and corridors are large and lofty, and visitors are invariably impressed by their brightness and airiness.

The bedrooms are divided by curtains into cubicles, thus ensuring privacy, and on the top story of the main building is a large room which is available for drill, dancing, fencing, and for recreation.

Course of Instruction

PREPARATORY DEPARTMENT—Scripture, Reading, Writing, Spelling, Number, Brushwork, Modelling, Needlework, Singing, Games, Drill, use of Montessori Apparatus.

FORMS I. AND II.—Scripture, Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Mythology, French, Geography, Grammar, History, Nature Study, Brushwork, Drawing, Plain Sewing, Drill, Morris Dancing, Singing.

FORMS III. AND IV.—Scripture, Reading, Writing, Spelling, Arithmetic, Grammar, English and Canadian History, Literature, Geography, Nature Study, Drawing and Brushwork, Singing, Drill, (in Form IV. German or Latin, Algebra, Geometry).

FORMS V. AND VI.—Scripture, McGill Matriculation Requirements in Literature, History, Languages, Mathematics and Science, Singing, Drill.
