Also known as Sydenham, is a village in Burford township, Brant County, 14 miles west of Brantford, the county seat and nearest bank location, and 5 west of Burford, on the B & T line G W div G T Ry, the nearest shipping point. Settled in 1856. It contains Episcopal and Methodist churches and public school, and ships lumber and produce. It is on the stage route from Burford to Woodstock. Population, 200. Mail daily. Also known as Cavanville, a village on a creek (which furnishes power) and on the O div C P Ry, in Cavan township, Durham county, 20 miles north-west of Cobourg, the county seat, and 4 north of Millbrook, the nearest bank location. Settled in 1820. It contains woollen and flour mills, Episcopal and Methodist churches and common schools, and ships live stock, grain, wool and produce. It is on the stage route from Millbrook to Mount Pleasant. Population, 250. Express, Dominion. Mail daily. Mrs Martha Walker, postmaster.

CAYUGA. An incorporated village, 70 miles from Toronto, on the Grand river, at the head of navigation, and on the L line G W div G T Ry, in North Cayuga township, Haldimand County, of which it is the county seat, and 15 north-west of Dunnville the nearest banking point. It was incorporated in 1859, has flour and saw mills, a foundry, and other industries; contains Presbyterian, Methodist, Catholic and Episcopal churches, a high and public school, with 270 pupils, a town hall seating 300, and a weekly newspaper, the *Haldimand Advocate*. There are quarries of limestone.

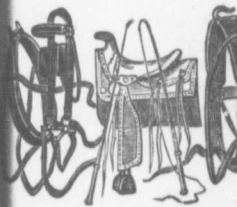
