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nay, in his discretion, omit to destroy prorder the destruction of the colonies and hives in which the disease exists.

The Inspector shall have full 1 Sub power, in his discretion, to order any wher or possessor of bees dwelling in he box-hives, in apiaries where the disase exists (being mere boxes without rames), to transfer such bees to moveble frame hives within a specified time nd in default of such transfer, the Inpector may destroy, or order the desruction of, such box hives and the bees welling therein.

> 5. Any owner or possessor of diseased plonies of bees, or of any infected apliances for bee-keeping, who knowingly ells or barters or gives away such disased colonies or infected appliances, hall, on conviction thereof before any istice of the Peace, be liable to a fine not less than \$50 or more than \$100 to imprisonment for any term not exeeding two months.

6. Any person whose bees have been estroyed or treated for foul brood, who ills or offers for sale any bees, hives or purtenances of any kind, after such struction or treatment, and before ing authorized by the Inspector so to , or who exposes in his bee-yard, or sewhere, any infected comb, honey, or her infected thing, or conceals the t that said disease exists among his es.shall' on convictisn before a Justice the Peace, be liable to a fine not less an \$20 and not more than \$50 or to prisonment for a term not exceeding o months and oot less than one onth.

Any owner or possessor of bees orefuses to allow the Inspector or assistant or assistants to freely exine said bees, or the premises in ich they are kept, or who refuses to troy the infecred bees and appurces, or to permit them to be desyed when so directed by the Inspector y, on the complaint of the Inspector. summoned before a Justice of the ice, and on conviction, shall be liable fine of not less than \$25 and not te than \$50 for the first offence, and less than \$50 and more than \$100 for second and any subsequent offence, the said Justice of the Peace shall te an order directing the said owner possessor forthwith to carry out the ctions of the Inspector.

Where an owner or possessor of

bees disobeys the directions of the said Inspector, or offers resistance to, or obstructs the said Inspector, a Justice of the Peace may, upon the complaint of said Inspector, cause a sufficient number of special constables to be sworn in, and such special constables shall, under the directions of the Inspector, proceed to the premises of such owner or possessor and assist the Inspector to seize a'l the diseased colonies and infected appurtenances and burn them forthwith, and if necessary the said Inspector or constables may arrest the said owner or possessor and bring him before a Justice of the Peace to be delt with according to the provisions of the proceeding section of this Act.

). Before proceeding against any person before a Justice of the Peace, the said Inspector shall read over to such person the provisions of this Act or shall cause a copy thereof to be delivered to such person.

10. Every beekeeper or other person who is aware of the existance of foul brood, either in his own apiary or elsewhere, shall immediately uotify the President of the Ontario Bee Keepers Association of the existance of such disease, and in default of so doing shall on summary oonviction before a Justice of the Peace be liable to a fine of \$5 and costs.

11. Upon receiving the notice in the preceding section mentioned or in any way becoming aware of the existence of foul brood in any locality, the said President shall immediately direct the said Inspector to proceed and inspect infected premises; but where the person giving such notice is unknown to the President or there is reason to believe that the information in said notice is untrustworthy, or that the person giving such notice is actuated by improper motives, then the President may require the person giving such notice to deposit the sum of \$5 with the President as a guarantee of good faith, before the said notice is acted upon, and if it proves that said notice was properly given, then the said deposit shall be returned to the person giving such notice, but other-wise the said deposit shall be forfeited to the use of the said Ontario Bee Keepers' Association.

12. The said Association shall include in its annual report to the Minister of Agricultural a statement of the
