RENFREW, ONT.—T. B. Caldwell, M.P., has submitted to the Town Council a proposition to furnish the town with electric power from a plant to be installed at Calabogie.

BERLIN, ONT.—At a public meeting held here last week, a special committee was appointed to take steps towards the establishment of a rural telephone system for Waterloo county.

CARBERRY, MAN.—The Council favor the establishment of an electric light plant here, and negotiations to that end are now being carried on with Mr. Boise, of Portage la Prairie.

NEW HAMBURG, ONT.—Tenders for building an addition to the public school will be received by J. Ernst up to Wednesday, 15th inst. Plans by C. Kaechtel, architect, Berlin.

WOLSELEY, N. W. T.—Adams & Blute will receive tenders up to 8th inst. for a frame and brick veneered hotel to be built at Filmore. Plans by C. Caron, architect, this place.

BRIDGEBURG, ONT.—G. O'Connor has purchased a building lot on Lewis street.—J. W. Aikens intends building a new hotel here, two stories, brick, 50 bedrooms, elevator, cost \$20,000.

FORT FRANCES, ONT.—The by-law to raise \$20,000 for erection of town and fire hall and purchase of pumping engine, chemical engine, etc., will be submitted to the ratepayers on March 6th.

CHARLOTTETOWN, P. E. I.—The ratepayers having declared strongly in favor of municipal ownership of the electric light plant, it is likely that the council will take steps at once to install a plant.
