## Concerning Renewals Due and Overdue

we take this method of notifying subscribers whose renewals are NOW due, and others whose renewals are months, and, in a few cases years OVERDUE, that IMMEDIATE PAYMENT of their subscriptions WILL BE GREATLY APPRECIATED. In ordinary times the necessity of sending reminders by mail is a real tax on a periodical whose rate is only \$1. a year, but in such times as these, the need for mailing notices to overdue subscribers becomes a heavy burden above the other monthly mailing charges.
