### *Army Bills.*

### *Bills brought in by Members of this House.*

For the better regulation of the Press within the Province of Lower Canada. Read a first time, 13. Read a second time, 17. House in Committee on the same. Report with Amendments. The same agreed to by the House. The Bill ordered to be engrossed, 24. Read a third time, 25. Passed and ordered to the House of Assembly for acquiescence, 26.

To alter and amend the Criminal Law in certain cases and to provide more effectual remedies against the commission of crimes and offences. Read a first time, 23. Read a second time, 25. House in Committee on this Bill, 27. Report with Amendment. The same agreed to by the House. The Bill to be engrossed, 28. Read a third time. Passed and ordered to the Assembly for acquiescence, 29.

Concerning future Notarial Acts or Deeds to carry Mortgages and to establish Offices for the enregistrement of all such Acts or Deeds within this Province. Read a first time, 38. Read a second time. Ordered to be printed, 45.

For improving the winter Roads in this Province and tending to introduce a different principle of construction in the Winter Carriages, so as to avoid the formation of cahots and slopes. Read a first time. Ordered to be Read a second time, 44.

### *Bills sent up by the Assembly.*

To continue for a limited time, an Act passed in the 48th year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to regulate the trial " of controverted Elections or Returns of Members to serve in " the House of Assembly of Lower Canada." Received by Message, 15. Read a first time, 19. Read a second time, 23. Read a third time. Passed. Acquiescence of the House signified to the Assembly, 25. Royal Assent, 46.

To establish a Watch in the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, to light the said Cities, and to defray the expence thereof. Received by
