" of Nova-Scotia and Canada: And the sum of Fisteen Pounds for the purpose of repairing the Road leading from Pickle's Farm on the River Kennebeckatis, to Cross's Farm on Hammond River; to be paid to such persons as His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor shall appoint for the purposes aforestiad, who are severally to account to the House of Assembly for their respective expenditures.

"Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of Ten "Pounds, Five Shillings, be granted to the Sheriff of the County of Charlotte, "for returning a Member for the said County to serve in General Assembly. "Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of

"Thirty-two Pounds, Five Shillings, be granted to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, for defraying the expence of printing Three Hundred
Copies of the Acts passed in the last Session of the General Assembly; and

"the further sum of Sixty-seven Pounds, Ten Shillings, for the payment of House-rent for the accommodation of the General Assembly and the Courts of Justice.

"Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of Two "Hundred Pounds, be granted to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, for defraying the expences to be incurred by the revising of all the Acts of the General Assembly of this Province and printing Two Hundred Copies of the same for the use of the several Branches and Members of the Legislature, His Majesty's Courts of Justice, Attorney and Solicitor General; "Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs and Coroners in the several Counties, and "Clerks of the different Parishes.

"Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of "Twelve Pounds, be granted to Samuel Lee, Esquire, Member for Northumber-" land County, for his travelling charges at the last Session of the General "Assembly.

"Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the following fums be granted to the several persons hereafter mentioned—that is to say—"To John M'Monagle, Esquire, the sum of Twelve Pounds, Fourteen Shillings and Six Pence: To Benjamin Dewolf, the sum of Eighteen Pounds, Fourteen "Shillings and Ten Pence: To Thomas Walker, the sum of Twelve Pounds, Ten "Shillings and Two Pence: To Henry Rutherford, the sum of Eighteen Pounds, "Eighteen Shillings: To Messrs. Bonnell and Budd, the sum of One Pound, "Seven Shillings and Nine Pence: And to Messrs. Isaac and David Bonnett, "the sum of Two Pounds, Seventeen Shillings—being the amount of duties paid by them on articles imported by the way of Saint John, which were inten-"ded for and consumed in the Province of Nova-Scotia.

"Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of Forty"Three Pounds, Five Shillings and Ten Pence, be granted to William and Thomas
"Pagan and Company, being the whole amount of the duties paid by them on
"Forty-six Puncheons of Rum, landed from on board the Brig Three Brothers,
"(which put into the Port of Saint John, on her voyage from Jamaica for
"Quebec, in distress) and afterwards re-shipped for Halifax.

"Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of Fifty "Pounds, be granted to Samuel Duffy, Keeper of the Light-House on Partridge" Island, in addition to his Salary, for his services to the first day of January, "One Thousand Eight Hundred and One.

"Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a fum not exceeding Fifty Pounds, be granted to the Commissioners of the Light-House on Partridge Island, for the purpose of making such repairs to the same as may be found necessary.
