And a further Sum of Two Thousand Pounds, to His Excellency the Outstanding claims. Governor, towards liquidating outstanding claims on the Executive, and to meet prospective deficiencies.

And a turther Sum of Fifty Pounds, to remunerate the Two Clerks in Secretain the Secretary's Office, for extra Labor arising from the past session ry's Office, for extra having been protracted to a period of Four Months.

And be it further enacted, that the Sums of Money, hereby granted, Monies to be paid by shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Colony, in discharge of such Warrant on the Warrant or Warrants as shall be issued by the Governor or Person Treasurer. Administering the Government of the Colony for the time being, in favour of any Person or Persons, to be applied to the purposes of this Act, and that it shall not be lawful for the said Treasurer to Pay any Treasurer not to pay Sum or Sums of Money out of the Treasury of the Colony, other than any Money except such as are expressed and directed in this or some other Act or Acts of what is expressly the Legislature of this Colony.
