GRAVE, Esquire, Governor and
Commander-in-Chief in and over
the Island of Newfoundland and
its Dependencies, &c.*

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING :

WHEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this Island stands PRO-
ROGUED until WEDNESDAY the TWENTY-FOURTH day of
OCTOBER instant : and whereas I think fit to PROROGUE the said
GENERAL ASSEMBLY until WEDNESDAY the TWELFTH day of DECEM-
BER next : I do therefore, by this my Proclamation, further PRO-
ROGUE the said GENERAL ASSEMBLY until WEDNESDAY the TWELFTH
day of DECEMBER next, as aforesaid : of which all Persons con-
cerned are required and commanded to take due notice and govern
themselves accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal
of the Island of Newfoundland, at the
Government House, at St. John's, in
the said Island, this Twenty-Second
day of October, 1866, and in the
Thirtieth Year of Her Majesty's
Reign.
