

Proclamation.

A. MUSGRAVE, Governor. [L. S] By His Excellency ANTHONY MUS-GRAVE, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Newfoundland and its Dependencies, &c.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING :

WHEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this Island stands PRO-BOGUED until WEDNESDAY the TWENTY-FOURTH day of OCTOBER instant: and whereas I think fit to PROROGUE the said GENERAL ASSEMBLY until WEDNESDAY the TWELFTH day of DECEM-BER next: I do therefore. by this my Proclamation, further PRO-ROGUE the said GENERAL ASSEMBLY until WEDNESDAY the TWELFTH day of DECEMBER next, as aforesaid: of which all Persons concerned are required and commanded to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

> Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Island of Newfoundland, at the Government House, at St. John's, in the said Island, this Twenty-Second day of October, 1866, and in the Thirtieth Year of Her Majesty's Reign.
