Czar Ferdinand Appeals to German General to Save the **Country From Invasion—Complete Change in** the Foreign Policy Impending

Paris, Sept. 26 .- Fresh dispositions made by General Franchet d'Esperey, who has passed through Prilep, justified the belief that there will be an energetic exploitation of the great inter-Allied victory in Macedonia, says Marcel Hutin, editor of The Echo de Paris. King Ferdinand of Bulgaria has asked General Mackensen, who is now in Bucharest, to take the command of his armies so as to

block the advance of the Allies in old Serbia and preserve Bulgaria from invasion, according to information received here from Switzerland. MINISTERIAL CRISIS.




