Manufacture.

A short time ago we printed out the advantages which would accrue to the town by the establishment of a manufactory in our midst, and promised to refer again to the subject, pointing out some of the benefits of manufacturing which might be carried on with profit and success.

In the first place the manufacturing of Agricultural implements should pay well. The County of Huron itself should afford a market for a large number of Reapers, Mowers, Threshing Machines, Ploughs, etc. every year, and from the fact that we are on the lake, so that coal and iron, and all kinds of heavy material could be brought in by water, we occupy a more favorable position for the carrying on of such a business extensively than any other place in the County.

But though a very rich local demand might be expected, we should have to trust to other outlets for the carrying on of our business. The great North-west affords this. There are no farms or stock on the entire of all kinds. In addition to the better machines which are required, there will be a large demand for saws, axes, forks, and all the kind of tools, hoes, and large quantities of iron and steel, and a large number of articles which will be required for that section of the country.

The Market Question.

As will be seen from our report of the proceedings of the Town Council, a by-law is to be submitted to the ratepayers of the town, authorizing the purchase of the Huron Hotel property as a site for a Town Hall and Market House.

It is high time a step was put to the roadway which may be daily witnessed at the Huron Hotel, and which will have the effect of making our town notorious, and preventing people, especially ladies, from coming to it except when absolutely necessary.
