Names that are not True.

An editorial in the "Popular Science News" recites some of the curiosities of names of chemical compounds which, when their appropriateness is considered, appear extremely ridiculous. Thus: Oil of vitriol is no oil, neither an oil of turpentine and kerosene. Copperas is an iron compound, and contains no copper, salts of lemon is the extremely poisonous oxalic acid, carbonic acid is not an acid, but an alcohol. Cobalt contains none of the metal, but arsenic. Soda-water has no trace of soda, nor does sulphuric ether contain sulphur. Sugar of lead has no sugar, cream of tartar has nothing of cream, nor milk of lime any milk. Oxygen means the acid-maker; but hydrogen is the essential element of all acids, and many contain no oxygen. German silver contains no silver, and black lead no lead. This list might readily be extended, both in chemical and other natural sciences; and it is only fair to state that these terms come from the older writers, and have given way to a more scientific nomenclature.

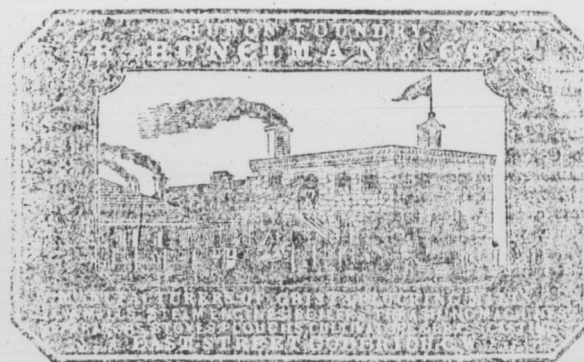
