



A By-Law to provide for the Erection of a Registry Office for the North Riding of the County of Welling-ton, the Repair of the Registry Office in Guelph, and to assist in making certain Roads and Bridges in the said County, and for issuing Debentures to the amount of \$20,000 for these surpass. for these purposes.

And whereas a copy of this by-law hath beam duly rubilabed according to law, Therefore the Corporation of the County of Wellington, in pureance\_of the powers in it in that behalf verted, and by the Coundit thereof enacts as fol-lows: That the Warden of the said County for the time being, be, and he is hereby authorized, empowered, and re-quired for the purposes aforesaid, to issue in due form of law the sum of twenty thousand dollars in debentures of the said Corporation of the said County and there and the sum of twenty thousand dollars in debentures of the said Corporation of the said County, and that every such debenture shall berin-terest at the rate of six per cent. per annum from the date of its issue, payable half yearly at thesaid office, and shall be signed by the Warden, and countre signed by the Treasurer of the time being of the asid County, and thall have at-tached thereto coupons for the payment of asid interest, which debentures and have set warden is hereby authorized to negoti-te and dispose of.
