A *Peer* writes to the *Times* respecting the majority of the present Conservative Government in the House of Lords, and puts it as low as 20. It seems that from the date of Mr. Gladstone's accession to power in December, 1868, to February 1874—a period of 270 weeks—the Premier has created 38 new peers, equivalent to one new peer for each seven weeks. This is exclusive of promotions in the peerage and the appointment of bishops.

STORM SIGNAL.—The port of Presque Isle on the Owen Sound Bay, under the energetic supervision of Mr. Mackenzie, is growing rapidly in importance. Not only has a lighthouse been erected there, but it is to be made a storm signal station. It will be put in direct communication with the Observatory at Toronto, where an intelligence of approaching storms will be telegraphed, and a signal, consisting of a large drum, hoisted at Presque Isle to warn the mariners on these waters.

BLACKWOOD for March has been received from the Leonard Scott publishing Co., New York. Amongst its contents we find continuations of the serials "Valentine and his Brother," and "Disorder in Dreamland," and the first part of a new story "Alice Lorraine," which promises to surpass the others in interest. "Lord Stanhope and the Historians of Queen Anne's Reign" is, perhaps, the most striking article in this number. It contains sketches of many of the prominent men of the day, including Marlborough, Godolphin, "Orator Henley," etc., besides a brief notice of some of the more important events of that reign; also two political articles, "The Elections of 1868 and 1874," and "Mr. Gladstone's Night Attack and its Results."
