The blaze made a big reflection that could be easily seen across the

bay. Mr. Baxter says his loss will be in the neighborhood of \$25,000. It was only partially covered by insurance. There were about 10,000 bushels of grain and a considerable quantity of flour stored in the warehouse. Mr. Baxter has been very unfortunate, having been visited by a fire only a few years age. Nobody seems to know anything further about the origin of the fire than that, it started in the basement of the mill.

Chicago, April 27.-The grain elevator owned by John J. Badenoch was completely destroyed by fire to-night. Loss on building and contents will ap-60 proximate \$200,0000. Standing next to the elevator is the power house of the West Chicago Street Railway Company. At 1 o'clock there were grave fears that the power house would be destroyed. 
