McDonnell or any other party hauled away from the said wharf during the year 1912, a portion of the gravel covering or filling thereof, for use in making concrete used in the construction of the new Opera House there? If so, who authorized or permitted the removal of the said gravel?

3. Is the government aware that Mr. Arthur E. O'Leary, brother of Mr. Richard O'Leary, has now, or recently had, as alleged, a team engaged in hauling gravel from the covering or filling of said wharf? If so, who gave permission for such action and what price is being paid for the privilege?

4. Has any revenue been received from the sale of gravel taken off said wharf, or for the privilege of using such gravel, since January 1, 1912?

Mr. Rogers:  
1. There is no wharfing.

**FARM SETTLEMENT BOARD SCHEME WORKING WELL**

The sale of three more farms by the Farm Settlement Board of the province was concluded yesterday. These are situated at Knowlesville, near Woodstock, and at North Ridge, Glassville. The purchase of another farm at Upper Manguerville, Sunbury, was also concluded. Applications for several other farms are in the hands of the board. The farm at Knowlesville was bought by two sons of the farmer who owned the adjoining farm, and as they wished to have a farm of their own they made arrangements with the board to take over the adjoining farm, on which there are two houses.

The immigration office, Mr. Gilchrist says, is continually in receipt of letters from satisfied settlers, who find the conditions here all that were promised. One was received yesterday stating the satisfactory conditions which the new settler found in the farm life of the province.

At the present time there are several old country people who have received assistance from the immigration authorities towards their passage money. Quite a number of people have been assisted since the fund was started, Mr. Gilchrist says, and so far there has been very little loss, the immigrants in nearly all cases keeping faith with the board. The second last instalment was received yesterday from the head of a family of nine who arrived about a year ago and who received an advance of more than \$100. Only a few dollars remain to be cleared off. Half the passage money is advanced to the immigrant after careful inquiries as to his character, and a guarantee is now being taken from his friends as well.

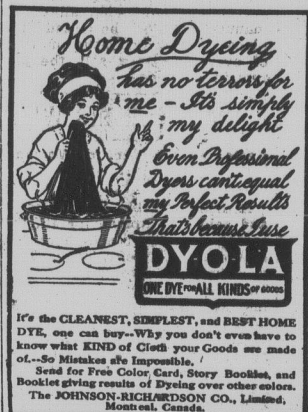

**PRESBYTERY OF MIRAMICHI**

A special meeting of the Presbytery of Miramichi was held in the Hall of St. John's Church, Chatham, on Tuesday evening, Rev. D. Henderson was appointed moderator pro tem. Rev. J. M. MacLean, the clerk, reported that he had moderated in a call at Tabusintac on May 18, which had come out in favor of Rev. Geo. Tattler. It had been signed by 125 communicants and 255 adherents and was accompanied with a guarantee of \$500 stipend, glebe, and three weeks holidays. The call and relative documents were then placed on the table. Mr. Wm. Anderson and Mr. Eubulus McCallum appeared in support of the call and testified to the unanimity which pervaded the congregation and their earnest desire that Mr. Tattler should accept the call. Mr. Anderson spoke of the splendid services which had been rendered by Mr. A. D. Archibald who occupied the pulpit during the vacancy. He had discharged his duties with credit to himself and great satisfaction to the congregation. A resolution, passed by the congregation of New Carlisle, urged that the translation of Mr. Tattler be not granted. He has done excellent work at New Carlisle during the eight years of his pastorate and was considered to be just the man to carry on the work for many years to come. The call was then placed in Mr. Tattler's hands and in a brief speech accepted by him. Arrangements were made for his induction at Tabusintac on Thursday, 19th June, at 4 p.m. Rev. J. M. MacLean is to preside and induct, Rev. D. Henderson to preach, Rev. S. I. McArthur to address the minister and Rev. F. C. Simpson to address the congregation.

Application was made to the General Assembly for leave to take on trial for license Mr. J. Hattie who has just completed his studies for the ministry at the Presbyterian College, Montreal. There seems to have been a slight irregularity in his course of study. The Presbytery then adjourned.



**A LITTLE MONARCHY**

Arran, an interesting Scottish island kingdom, is ruled over by a woman, the beautiful Marchioness of Graham, wife of the eldest son and heir of the Duke of Montrose. It was as Lady Mary Hamilton that the Marchioness inherited this little monarchy from her father, the late Duke of Hamilton, whose only child she was. As sole owner of this seagirt kingdom, the Marchioness rules wisely and well over loyal subjects, numbering in all nearly five thousand.

The island, which is some nine miles long and ten and a half broad with an area of a hundred and sixty-eight square miles, has had a romantic history. Along the cliffs of the South coast there are several large caverns, one being known as the King's Cave. Here Robert the Bruce is said to have hidden himself for some time, while it was from Brodick Bay that Bruce sailed to Carrick on his expedition for the recovery of the crown. These are many interesting ruins, too, such as Lochranza Castle, once the residence of the Scots Kings. Then there are cairns, standing stones and stone circles.

A few years ago several stone coffins were found in a cairn two hundred feet in circumference. Brodick Castle, the owner's residence, is on the site of an old and historic structure, but it has been rebuilt within recent times in Scotch baronial style. Situated upon the northwest shore of Brodick Bay, its position is an exceptionally fine one. In 1902, when cruising in these waters, King Edward paid a visit to the castle.
