BANKER'S VIEW ON CONDITIONS HERE

Sir Vincent Meredith Optimistic Over Commercial Situation.

London, May 2.—Sir Vincent Meredith, president of the Bank of Montreal, takes an optimistic view of the commercial situation in Canada in an interview in the Times. He declares that general conditions are on the whole satisfactory, though there has been in many cases been an accumulation of high priced stocks which will have to be liquidated, probably with some losses, before normal conditions return. He said Canada has a heavy war debt and high taxation, but will probably emerge from present difficulties sooner than many other countries.

The present Canadian banking system was admirably adapted to the requirements of the country Sir Vincent affirmed with emphasis, adding that Canadian bankers had decided that the suggested federal reserve bank which had been sometimes advocated, would be an unnecessary and expensive luxury giving no better facilities to the business to the country than was now provided.

Liquor valued at \$25,000 was seized yesterday afternoon by a staff of prohibition inspectors at St. Leonard's where it had been secreted under the floor of a barn.

Chief Inspector Hawthorn got a tip on the presence of the liquor a few days ago and inspectors Fraser, Saunders, of this city, and Tom Barrett, of St. John, were assigned for duty on the case with Inspector Allan McLaughlin, who is in charge of the upper St. John river district.

After the seizure they at once arranged for shipment to the Government warehouse here and the carload either tonight or tomorrow.

It is said that the seized goods include 188 cases and 29 barrels of various brands of liquors, the case being the large size, which are made to contain Imperial quarts of whiskey, brandy and gin.
