CHRONIC BRONCHITIS.
Bronchitis is an inflammation of the mucous membrane of the bronchial tubes, and is one of the most common of the pulmonary affections. Chronic bronchitis most often occurs later in life. When a cold settles on the lungs, the disease either ends in pneumonia, or it settles on the bronchial tubes, and the patient does not feel entirely well. He feels tired and languid, and complains of taking his usual amount of exercise, and experiences a shortness of breath, with much coughing, and a hoarseness of the voice. Soon after this cough appears, accompanied by a mucous secretion, and in some cases a watery discharge from the nose, and in some cases a watery discharge from the eyes. The patient dies from exhaustion and suffocation. In the later stages of the disease the mucous membrane of the larger bronchial tubes, and in the smaller tubes and air cells of the lungs, becomes more and more congested and inflamed. There is no cavity nor tubercle in the lungs, but merely a swelling away of the lining of the bronchial tubes and air cells of the lungs. The patient dies from exhaustion and suffocation. In some cases it is a light straw or yellowish color. Sometimes streaks of blood make their appearance in the mucus, and at times there is a discharge of pus. Persons thus afflicted are very nervous and irritable, and are unable to take any food, and it is not uncommonly the case that the patient dies in one of these attacks.

SPRIT OF PARLIAMENT.
CAUSE OF THE DELAY BEFORE EARLY REPLY.
Mr. Patterson's Motion to go into Committee of Supply-An Interesting Debate-An Early Adjournment.

OTTAWA, April 5.—In the house of commons today Mr. Patterson (British) made an exhaustive speech in opposition to the sugar duties, concluding with the following amendment to the motion to go into supply:
That the speaker do not leave the chair, but that the resolution that under the operation of the existing duties on sugar the people have paid too much for sugar, and that it is expedient to reduce the duties on sugar, after adding the condition that the duties on sugar should be reduced to the Canadian consumer, be carried.

An Ottawa Young Man.
OTTAWA, April 5.—Alfred Foster, a young man who has been doing a brokerage business here for some time, has been arrested, leaving behind \$14,000 liabilities, besides a confession of having forged some \$18,000 worth of paper. A number of the men of standing among his victims, and nothing is known of his whereabouts.

No Additional Light.
HAMILTON, April 5.—To-night the adjourned inquest in the Poole murder was resumed at Durham. Further evidence was taken, but without throwing any light on the case. The coroner's jury was sworn in to whom the witnesses examined were John Wilson, a chum to the deceased, Wm. Johnson, J. J. Fisher, Brown, a barber, and the medical testimony of the post mortem. The jury adjourned for two weeks for further evidence.

Plains Patrick Smyth.
LONDON, April 5.—Patrick Smyth, M. P., replying to the resolution of the Tipperary commission, concerning a parliamentary act, said: "Case your babbling about things you do not understand. If you are not utterly lost to every sense of patriotic honor, feeling, respect for the land reduced to a condition of savagery. See the recent outrages and reserve your curses for the leaders of this party, who brought all this ruin of shame upon our nation."

Romance of a Crime.
DETROIT, April 5.—Jacob Belle was murdered in a Wisconsin forest last January. He was a lumberman and worked with a single companion. This person disappeared immediately after the deed, and was regarded as guilty of it, but could nowhere be found. Not even a trace of the fugitive was discovered, and the search for him has been given up. A few days ago the widow of Belle fell dangerously ill. Nellie, the nearest village to the place where he was killed, and a few days ago she died. She confessed that she was his lover. He had compelled her to dress as a man and work with him in the woods. Worn out by the heavy labor, and driven desperate by his cruelty, she murdered him. She then hurried home, put on her own clothing, and nobody identified her as the "fellow" who had been her husband's assistant.
