Coroner Harris' inquest at the Hunter last night touching the death of the old woman Susan Gibbs, found murdered in her hut on Saturday evening, was a plain and circumstantial weight in the eyes of the coroner and County Attorney Patton to place him under arrest. Harris is a married man with four children and lives nearly opposite Old Susie's hut in Stock's siding, Harris, according to the traditions of the Hunter, was about the only neighbor whom the murdered woman took at all into her confidence. He helped her at times in her lowly business transactions, and did odd jobs for her. He is a man of approximately 50 years of age, eccentric in talk and habits and has a broad Lancashire dialect. The evidence against him so far is apparently weak. When the inquest adjourned at 12:15 this morning he was removed to the county jail in charge of two constables. He stoutly disclaimed any connection with the crime and declared that he was as true as the "four corners of the world."
