DELIBERATIONS OF THE COUNCIL OF AGRI-CULTURE.-26th OCTOBER, 1891.

The Council of Agriculture met, at the usual place, on Wednesday morning, October 26th, 1891, at 10 A. M.

Present : The Hon. H. G. Joly de Lotbinière, president ; The Hon. MM. Ouimet and Sylvestre; and MM. Pilon, 6 vice-president, Blackwood, A. Casgrain, Champagne, Décarie, Fisher, Lussier, Marsan, Morier, Moore, Ness. Póloquin, Ricard, Rocheleau, and Valois.

The president introduced to the council Mr Collamer Moore, their new colleague, named by an order in Council, dated June 2nd, 1891.

The deliberations of the last meeting of the council were read and approved.

The president made a verbal report of a visit paid by him, and M. Pilon, of the committee on schools, to the agricultural school at Ste. Anne Lapocatière, and expressed the sitisfaction they felt at the progress made by the students since M. Lippens had acted as professor of agriculture.

1. The president submitted a report showing the manner in which the agricultural societies have discharged the duty of sending in the affidavits required by section 1669 S. R. P. Q.

The council of agriculture sees with pleasure that the in-11 tervention of the committee on agriculture of the legislative assembly during the last session has borne its fruits.
