Mr. W. D. Boyd, Simcoe, Ont., submitted for our inspection a 3c Canada numeral surcharged with the figure "2" above the word "cents," the whole being in the center of the stamp. The letter had been posted at Jarvis, Ont., and passed without detection. We sent the stamp to the P. O. Dept. at Ottawa and received the following reply.

Ottawa April 23, 01. Gentlemen:-In reply to your letter of the 20th I am directed to say that the surcharge in this case is clearly a spurious one, as anyone acquainted with the authorized surcharge may easily see. There was only the one lot of 3c stamps surcharged by this Dept., and these were all surcharged by the same plate, which bore the inscription "2 cents" at the lower edge of the stamp, and occupied only one line.
