

(Montreal in 1760.)

ATELY, we gave a biographical sketch of Sir Jeffry Amherst, Knight of the Bath. A correspondent has sent us, to complete the work, a copy of the inscriptions prepared for the Monument erected to his memory by his son, Sir J. Amherst, also Knight of the Bath.

This Monument, which is about 35 or 36 feet high, is situated on a pleasant eminence, opposite Lord

Amherst's dwelling-house, called "Montreal," near Riverhead, in Kent:-

(FIRST FACE LOOKING ALMOST SOUTH-EAST.)

DEDICATED

TO THAT MOST ABLE STATESMAN,

DURING WHOSE ADMINISTRATION CAPE BRITON AND CANADA WERE CONQUERED;

AND FROM WHOSE INFLUENCE THE DRITISH ARMS
DERIVED A DEGREE OF LUSTRE UNPARALLELED IN PAST AGES.
