A candidate may choose which of them he will take, but it is not compulsory to take either, and he cannot take both. The examination in agriculture will be based on the first seven chapters of the authorized text book in Agricul-

Value of Subjects.—Reading, 50 marks; Drawing, 50; Neatness, 35; Writing 59; Orthography, 30; Literature, 100; Arithmetic, 100; Grammar, 100; Geography, 75; Composition,

100; History, 75; Temperance, 75; Agriculture, 75. Of the marks for each of Drawing and 75. Of the marks for each of Drawing and Writing, 25 will be assigned to the paper on the subject, and a maximum of 25 may be awarded as the result of the inspection of the candidates drawing-book or copy-book.
