

Following is the text of the
Swedish Consumer Resolution (U.N. Doc.A/5855)
as passed by the Fifth Committee on
November 18, 1924, by a vote of 88 to 13 against
(Introducing Change) to 2 against, with 18
abstentions; and in the Second Plenary meeting
on December 4, 1924, by a vote of 45 to 13 against
(Introducing Change) to 2 against, with 3
abstentions.

"The General Assembly"

RECOMMENDING the decisions of the Assembly
resolution of the General Assembly of December
1923 to the General Assembly to adopt
interim solution on the basis of existing
new members are admitted to participate in
improvement in the economic status of
existing members permitted under
existing arrangements in the case;

RECOMMENDING the Resolution 88 (IV) of
the December 1923, by which the Committee on
Consumer Protection was charged to give
recommendation of countries with
income, and instructs the Committee to
continue to do so in the future;

INSTRUCTING the Committee on Consumer Protection
to submit a report to the Assembly
to instruct countries to assess
recommendations to those members
subject to the best possible
international cooperation over the level
of consumer protection in the field of
apparatus for the improvement of the
best possible benefit with the highest
standard of living among the members
the conditions of service in Resolution 88 (IV)
have been listed or otherwise
mention consumer welfare assessments".
