Mr. Chrétien, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table—Copies of Special Warrants issued under section 33 of the Financial Administration Act since the Dissolution of Parliament on May 8, 1974. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 301-1/258.

Mr. Chrétien, seconded by Mr. Macrae, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-23, An Act to provide for the payment of superannuation benefits to Lieutenant Governors, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 82(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to provide, in the amount and manner prescribed, for the payment of superannuation and supplementary retirement benefits to Lieutenant Governors and their spouses, and for the payment of interest on the return of contributions.

Mr. Sharp, seconded by Mr. Drury, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-24, An Act to amend the

Salaries Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 82(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the Salaries Act to increase the salaries of the Lieutenant Governors of the provinces from their present levels to \$35,000.

Mrs. Sauvé, seconded by Mr. Bellenger (Quebec), by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-25, An Act to protect human health and the environment from substances that contaminate the environment, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.
