RESOLVED, That the early, unfolicited and continued labours of Mr. THOMAS PAINE, in explaining and enforcing the principles of the late revolution, by ingenious and timely publications^{*} upon the nature of liberty and civil government, have been well received by the citizens of these States, and merit the approbation of Congress; and that in confideration of these fervices, and the benefits produced thereby, Mr. PAINE is entitled to a liberal gratification from the United States.

October 3, 1785.

RESOLVED, That the board of treafury take order for paying to Mr. THOMAS PAINE, the fum of three thousand dollars, for the confiderations mentioned in the refolution of the 26th of August last.
