

OPTION DROPPED ON TECK-HUGHES

Nipissing Company's Verdict on Kirkland Lake Property is Unfavorable.

SHARP BREAK IN STOCK

Over Thirty-Eight Thousand Shares Thrown on Market During Day.

Nipissing's option on Teck-Hughes has been dropped and all work on the Kirkland Lake prospect suspended. The news was confirmed yesterday at the office of President Crooks of the Teck-Hughes Company. Mr. Crooks could not be reached by The World and nothing definite is known as yet regarding the possible future plans in regard to the discarded property, upon which the Nipissing spent large sums in development work.

The stock has dragged along in a desultory way for some time past and market observers were expecting an unfavorable decision by the Nipissing Company. Depressing rumors filtered into the exchange early in the day, but nothing definite was known until late in the afternoon, when a flood of selling orders reached the market. The stock opened at 1-1/2, a small fraction off from the previous day, and closed at 7/8, a drop of 1/8.

Pearl Lake was an active issue, 17,400 shares selling at 2. Dome Lake was in better demand, selling up to 2-1/2. McIntyre sold at 31 and 32 in the forenoon and broke to 30 in the afternoon. Timiskaming eased to 18 and closed at 18-1/2. In all 92,000 shares were dealt in, the largest day's business for some months past.

WINNIPEG GRAIN MARKET.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 26.—The wheat market broke sharply this morning. Winnipeg opened 4 1/2 to 5/8 lower. A fair amount of export sales were transacted on the day, but the market was generally quiet. There were temporary rallies, but generally values kept down around the low points and trading was moderate.

The total number of inspections on Thursday were 374 cars, as compared with 112 cars in sight today were 165 cars.

BLACK LAKE ASBESTOS.

A loss for the year of \$32,297, as against a loss of \$1,000 in the previous year, reported by Black Lake Asbestos for 1914. Following the war the company's plant was closed down and remained idle until Sept. 20. Only 80 to 100 men are now engaged as the new pits opened did not prove as profitable as the old operations there have been discontinued.

The combined receipts of live stock at the two yards for the past week show an increase of 88 carloads, 287 hogs, 149 sheep, 79 calves and 576 horses, and a corresponding increase of 489 cars, 5302 cattle, 17,728 hogs, 2212 sheep and lambs, 460 calves and 934 horses, over the total for the month of February, 1914, which is a substantial increase in all the different classes of live stock.

Toronto Terminal Plans

The Montreal Gazette says: "The Toronto Terminal Co., which is to issue special bonds to the amount of \$15,000,000, has not actually commenced work yet. It has been given a large steel order, but Mr. Henry Phillips, secretary of the company, observed that he had heard nothing about any steel orders, and he would probably know about such order if it had been given."

"Hundreds of idle men in Toronto have been hoping that the work would start up, but the company has, first of all, to get the money. Mr. J. W. Leonard, who is or is to be the superintendent of construction, is an able, practical man, as he proved himself to be on the C.P.R. proper; and he will in this new position render valuable and efficient service, when the viaduct and Union Station get under way, which they have been vainly trying to do for 15 years past."

"When completed the work will be one of the greatest, if not the greatest, that the Queen City can show. The plans call for a large quantity of steel and architectural effort. When the money is procured employment will be given to over 1000 men. It is estimated that the entire work will cost \$20,000,000. That would have seemed easy before the war; but however unimpeachable the credit, it is difficult to secure money in large quantities today, although big financial firms in the States are turning to Canada with their investments, now that the dollar stream has ceased to flow from England."

ITALY IS NOT YET ON BRINK OF WAR

Preparations Stated to Be Mere Precaution Against Even - tualties.

LONDON, Feb. 26.—The Morning Post's correspondent at Rome cables "I have it on absolutely unimpeachable authority that General Cadorna, chief of general staff, stated last week that there was no prospect of war for the present. Italy goes on preparing, but the preparations are easily explained by the principle of *si vis pacem para bellum*." She naturally wishes to be in a position to make Italy necessary felt at a critical moment if it were.

She is, of course, experiencing some of the inevitable disadvantages of neutrality. War completely annihilated tourist traffic. It is felt, however, that Italy would suffer far more from an economic point of view if she were at war while the people had seven months to weigh arguments for and against intervention. Italian newspapers reiterate the request that foreigners do not give them advice as to the conduct of their own affairs but even now the Germans do not seem to have learned this obvious lesson.

THREE OF CREW LOST WHEN CARIB WAS SUNK

U.S. Vessel Went Down off Borkum Island, Where Evelyn Was Lost.

BERLIN, via London, Feb. 26.—Three members of the crew of the American steamer Carib lost their lives when the ship was sunk Tuesday in the North Sea, probably by a mine. It has been learned that the Carib went down off Borkum Island, at the mouth of the Ems River, and not near Helligoland (another island 45 miles northwest of the mouths of the Elbe and Weser Rivers), as was presumed from the first announcement.
