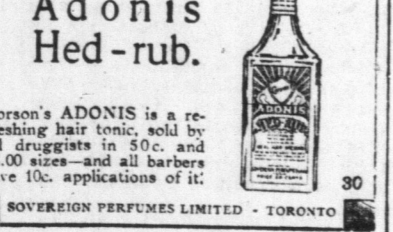

AUSTRIAN ATTACKS COMPLETELY FAIL

Three Attempts at Offensive Against Italians Break Down.

MANY CAPTURED TOO

Troops on Carnic Frontier Abandon Arms and Bucklers.

ROME, July 6, via Paris, July 7.—

The following Italian official statement was given out here tonight: "In the Tyrol and Trentino sector the Austrians attempted on Monday, to attack Forcella, the Col di Mezzo, to the west, and the three summits of our hands, arms and bucklers."

"Along the Carnic frontier the Austrians, on Monday night, resumed an attack on the entrenchment north of Val Grande. They were counter-attacked and thrown back with heavy losses, abandoning arms and bucklers for the infantry."

"Important forces also attacked the Italian position on Avosto Peak, but the troops defending it, having allowed the enemy to approach a short distance, counter-attacked and repulsed them."

FIRE ALARM STARTS MOTOR TRUCK ENGINES.

In order to facilitate the quick departure of the equipment from the station when an alarm is turned in, an ingenious electric starting device has been installed for the motor trucks of a California fire department.

A call is sent in from one of the fire circles, the engines of the motor cars are started automatically, so that there is no delay whatever in leaving after the firemen are once on the machine.

When the alarm is turned in, the switch is automatically closed, the starter thus formed actuating the motor.

When the driver jumps into the self-opening, throw in his clutch and start ahead. The plug is pulled out by the forward movement of the car.

BIRTHMARKS ARE REMOVED BY USE OF RADIIUM.

Radium has been used successfully during the past year at the Radium Institute in London for the removal of birthmarks. In a report recently issued it is asserted that the removal of birthmarks has been done more readily and with less risk of injury than by the use of caustics.

Following the treatment Superficial growths over which the rays have been directed are removed by acids, have also been treated by radium. This is done by the use of radium in the form of a plaster, which is supported by a popular subscription.

SCREENLESS APPARATUS FOR SIZING COAL.

Sizing coal without screens is made possible by a new sizer that consists simply of a succession of corrugated plates over which the coal is passed. The corrugations run lengthwise of the plates and the plates are inclined sidewise. Lumps of coal that are too large to be held at the side, while those held in the corrugations are shaken forward and deposited on the next plate. BRITISH REPULSED GERMAN ATTACKS

Section of Trench Captured Near Pilkem Object of Big Offensive.

SUCCESS ON MEUSE

French Retake Trench From Germans and Hold Them Off.

Special Cable to The Toronto World. LONDON, July 6.—The capture of 200 yards of trenches by British troops southwest of Pilkem was sufficient to provoke several counter-attacks by the Germans, but the thin khaki line held steadily and repulsed all attacks in regulation style.

This news was received thru the French war office tonight. The French also won a success on the ridge south of the Souvaux ravine on the heights of the Meuse, in the recapture of a trench taken by the Germans ten days ago. The French then pushed beyond this work and withstood a violent counter-attack of the Germans, which was repulsed by heavy bombardment. The French turned on him machine guns and the fiercest fire, which decimated his attacking columns.

Renewal of activity by the artillery of the Germans is reported in the Vosges region, where the hostile fire is directed primarily against Fontenelle, Hildenfirt, Hartmanns-Wellerkopf and Thann.

The Germans bombarded Arras and the cathedral in particular, with incendiary shells today. They also bombarded Rheims.
