BYLAW NO. 8

Of The Canada Scale and Slicer Company, Limited, Adopted by The Share-holders of the Company.

WHEREAS The Directors of The Canada Scale and Slicer Company, Limited, hereinafter called "the Company," on the 12th day of November, A.D. 1918, duly passed by bylaw of the Company, which, is in the words and figures following:

Bylaw No. 8 of The Canada Scale and Slicer Company, Limited, adopted by the Directors of the Company.

Whereas The Canada Scale and Slicer Company, Limited, hereinafter called "the Company," was, by the Honorable the Secretary of State for Canada, under the authority of The Companies Act, being the first part of Chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, duly incorporated by letters patent duly issued on the 5th day of October, 1917, in which it was provided that the chief place of business of the Company was in the City of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario;

And whereas The Company has been operating with its Head Office at Toronto and its principal place of business at the City of Brantford in the County of Brant, in the Province of Ontario;

And whereas The Directors have deemed it expedient and in the interest of the Company that the Head Office of the Company should be changed from Toronto to the Town of Bowmanville, in the County of Durham, and the place of business of the Company should be changed from Brantford to Bowmanville;

Be it enacted as a bylaw of the Company by the Directors of the Company that the Head Office of the Company shall henceforth be at the Town of Bowmanville, in the County of Durham, at such place therein as the Directors may from time to time decide.

That the principal place of business of the Company under the authority of the Secretary of State for Canada, shall be in the said Town of Bowmanville.

That the chief place of business of the Company shall be changed from the City of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario, to the said Town of Bowmanville, in the County of Durham, in the Province of Ontario.

That all future operations of the said Company shall be conducted from the said Town of Bowmanville.

This bylaw was duly passed at a meeting of the Directors of the Company held at Brantford on the 12th day of November, A.D. 1918, at which meeting all of the Directors of the Company were present, and all of said Directors voted for the adoption of same.

Be it enacted as a bylaw of the Company by the Shareholders of the Company in general meeting duly assembled, that the bylaw of the Company, in the recitals herebefore fully set out and contained, is hereby confirmed, approved and ratified and is now a bylaw of the Company in full force, virtue and effect.

This bylaw was unanimously sanctioned by a vote of the Shareholders of the Company present in person or by proxy at a general meeting duly called and held at Toronto on the 22nd day of November, 1918, at which Shareholders representing over two-thirds of the stock of the Company were in attendance.
