If this project is carried out and the Niagara-St. Catharines line is built, the company will have connections with practically every village in the district The road from St. Catharines Sunday schools, or about 2000 persons to Fonthfill has been completed and ex-

with practically every village in the district The road from St. Catharines to Fonthill has been completed and extensions will be built to Pelham and Welland. Whether the company will go on and build from St. Catharines to Beamsville, where a junction with the H. G. and B. Railway will be effected, has not been decided.

The Nicholls people control most of the land adjoining their main line, between the Falls and Stamford, and are offering inducements to capitalists to establish big manufacturing plants near the Falls. Two or three large ones are now being built. They will use a large amount of electric power and they get the land at the lowest figure.
