

Dufferin Track Record Day Lady May Paces Mile in 2:14.4

Beats Former Record by 2 1/4 Seconds—Over 2000 People in Attendance—Chapter of Accidents—None Serious.

There were many features at the Dufferin Driving Club's race meeting yesterday afternoon on the Dufferin track. In the first place the attendance was the largest in the history of the track, over 2000 people, including 200 ladies, being on hand to enjoy the racing, which was exciting throughout.

The main attraction was the appearance of Lady May, who was sent against the track record, 2:16 1/2. In this she was successful in her first attempt, when she paced in 2:14.4. Later on she went the distance in 2:14.1.

While scoring before the second heat of the Class B. race, the pacer, Al Patriot, reared up, throwing Jimmy Noble, Jr., off the sulky, and ran around the track once before being caught. In his run he collided with Prairie Oyster, throwing both the horse and his driver, Jack Montgomery, to the ground, but, fortunately, neither one was injured. Later on Planet did a little stunt, unseating driver Jimmy McDowell. The horse went partly around the track before he was caught.

In the second heat of Class C, the black pacer mare Maud R. fell, landing her driver, Davis, on the ground. She then started the track once, demolishing her sulky.

Another feature was the weak effort of driver Dwan behind the pacer S. D. C. in the first heat of Class C. The judges were not satisfied with the drive he put up and promptly assessed him \$10, which made a great improvement in his efforts in each of the succeeding heats.

The day was fine and the track as good as it was possible to make it, but at its best it is a very slow track, the footing being so breaking away badly under the horses' feet.

It was 3 o'clock when Jack Fleming appeared on the track with Lady May ready for her second race, when he paced to a long shaft sulky, was also on the job, but as a pacer this particular galloper is a distinct failure.

For a couple of scores Fleming nodded for the word, and at the first turn had to pull out to avoid running into the pacer, who was at the pole. The mare went to the quarter in 33 1/2 seconds, several lengths in front of the runner, who never did get up to be of any use. The half was passed in 1:08, and from there Fleming let her set up alone, pacing the last half in 1:06 3/4, which made the mile 2:15 3/4, a reduction of 3/4 of a second from Miss Delmar's time, 2:16 1/2.

After the finish of the record-breaking performance a silver cup was presented to Mrs. C. A. Burns of the firm of Burns & Sheppard, owners of Lady May, by the Dufferin Driving Club.

When the time of the mile was announced by Starter O'Halloran, a round of applause was given Driver Fleming and the handsome mare. Jack Montgomery captured the Class B. event, the first race in 33 seconds, straight heats, with Arthur Wales' recent purchase, Prairie Oyster, stepping the final heat in 1:08. In this event the contest for second place was most exciting. In the opening heat Baby Teeth beat the trotter Bay Billie for the place. Planet got up in time to be second in the next heat, then Western Boy took it into his head to go straight and made Prairie Oyster step in 1:08 to win.

The first heat in Class C. fell to Harry Lee, but Ewan's drive behind S. D. C., who finished second, was so tame that the judges tacked a fine, as the first turn in the second heat, and won easily, pulled up in 1:14 1/2, half a second faster than the opening heat. S. D. C. was always in front in the third and fourth heats.

Charles Snow with his little mare Rheda Wilkes was the winning combination in the last race on the card, the trotting mare Lady Wilkes landed the first heat, but after

that it was Rheda Wilkes, one, two, three. Snow's mare had her innings yesterday, racing consistently after the first heat, in which a break early in the half put her back in third place. The book in operation did a thriving business and probably had a little better of the players.

CROKER'S RHODORA WINS THE DEWHURST PLATE

King Edward's Perrier Was Second—Berry Maid Wins Packer Stakes at Jamaica.

NEWMARKET, Eng., Oct. 31.—Richard Croker's Rhodora, ridden by W. Bullock, won the Dewhurst Plate here to-day, beating King Edward's Perrier, which was second, and Baron DeForest's Little George, which came in third. Nine horses started.

Rhodora, started at 100 to 7 against an outsider, started at 100 to 7 against, and won by two lengths. The betting against the favorite was 6 to 1.

The Dewhurst Plate is of 300 sovereigns added to a sweepstakes of 50 sovereigns each, for 2-year-olds, distance seven furlongs.
