GOMEZ FORETOLD ALL THIS

Yellow Fever Will Soon Leave Spain Without an Army in Cuba—1900 in Havana Hospitals.

New York, July 13.—A special issue of the Recorder from Havana says: A panic prevails in the Spanish army in consequence of the terrible increase of yellow fever in the last few days. It is estimated that fully 40 per cent of the cases prove fatal.

The hospitals at Havana contain nearly 8000 patients, and every day the number is being increased.

On Friday 450 sick soldiers were brought in from Pinar del Rio Province. Physicians say that more serious diseases may result.

Dr. Murata, the Japanese army surgeon, who has been sent to Havana to see how a great epidemic of cholera is being checked.

The condition of the Spanish troops along the Trocha is awful. They are being taken to the hospitals in carts and on stretchers.

It is said that the Spanish army is likely to be disbanded before the summer is over.
