It shows that since Jan. 1, 1898, the Engineer has made some 170 initiative recommendations for new pavements. Of these just 40 shave been knocked out by petitions of ratepayers, 17 have been struck out in City Council, in 3 cases the recommendation has been withdrawn, in 4 referred back, while in 2 the Court of Revision has refused to confirm. So that of the 170 recommendations some 66, or over one-third, have been set aside, the responsibility resting as above shown.

On the other hand, Mr. Macdonald will have to plead his own case. He claims that he could not get a lawyer in Toronto to plead the case, because it concerned indirectly the County Judge's finances. Corporation Counsel Fullerton found no particular fault with his new brief yesterday. He excused the procedure on the ground that it had been customary and also because the defendants were being sued for deeds done in their aldermanic capacity. Mr. Fullerton, however, was not sure that this work came within the scope of his official functions.
