HON. PETER MITCHELL DEAD.

Another of the Founders of Confederation Has Passed Over to the Majority.

WAS FOUND DEAD IN HIS ROOM.

Stood by Sir Charles Tupper to the Last—His Death Was Very Sudden.

Montreal, Oct. 25.—(Special.)—"If you see Sir Charles Tupper, tell him that Peter Mitchell says he is a brick, and I don't care who knows my feelings. I have always entertained a very high opinion of Sir Charles and I wish him all sorts of good luck." These words were spoken to the World correspondent yesterday by the Hon. Peter Mitchell, but before they could be conveyed to the great leader of the Conservative party, the man who used to be known as Bismarck Mitchell had passed away.

Yesterday Mr. Mitchell was down town looking even better than he had done for some weeks past, and he retired to his room at the Windsor Hotel before the accustomed hour. This morning his dead body was found on the floor, and as the coat alone had been removed, the supposition is that Mr. Mitchell died before midnight.

Sir Charles Tupper, Sir Hector Langevin and Hon. Wm. Macdougall are all that are left of the nation's founders.

Hon. Peter Mitchell was born in New-Castle, N.B., in 1824, was of Scottish parentage. He was educated there and studied law. In 1848 he was called to the bar. Not long afterwards he engaged in the lumber business and shipbuilding. He was first elected to the legislature of New Brunswick in 1856, and remained a member of the Assembly until 1860, when he entered the legislative Council of the Confederation he was appointed to the Senate by royal proclamation, and became one of the Government leaders in the Senate. He resigned in 1874 and was elected to the House of Commons. In the general elections of 1878 he was defeated, but at the next election in 1883 was successful. He continued in the House until 1884, since that time he has not been in Parliament. He was a candidate for his old constituency in the elections of 1888 and 1892.

As a member of the Government of New Brunswick in 1858, he was a colleague of Messrs. Tilley, Ritchie, Johnson and Fisher. He, with some friends, led in securing the construction of provincial railways and in effecting other beneficial legislation. When the union of the Maritime Provinces was discussed he was selected a delegate to the Charlottetown Conference, where Sir John A. Macdougall, Cartier and Brown and others appeared to urge the larger union of British North America. He also attended the Quebec Conference, which drafted the terms of the Union, and in 1880 was sent to London to serve as a member of the London Conference on the same subject.

In January, 1883, Mitchell became proprietor of the Montreal Herald, which he conducted for several years. He afterwards retired from active politics, and on March 1, 1897, was appointed to the position of Inspector of Fisheries for the Atlantic Provinces.

He married in 1853 Mrs. George of St. John, N.B. She died in 1880.

An Oshawa Boy. On the arrival of the Canadian contingent at the station, Pte. Norman Rae, son of the late Lieut.-Col. Rae of the 34th Battalion, was met by Mr. Williams, James O'Connor and George H. Burt, a deputation from the R. S. Williams & Sons Co., piano and organ manufacturers, Oshawa, and presented with a purse of gold. Mr. George Burt, on behalf of the employees, extended the best wishes of his associates that he would acquire himself as becoming a good soldier of the Queen. Norman responded feelingly, and wished his thanks conveyed to the employees. Mr. Burt then, on behalf of the Oshawa Town Council, handed Pte. Rae \$25 in gold, and extended the hearty admiration and pride of the people of Oshawa that one of her brightest and most patriotic young men had been chosen as one of the contingent to uphold the honor and glory of the British Empire in far-off Africa, and that he would carry with him the best wishes of the hearty well-wishers of the citizens of Oshawa. Pte. Rae was entirely overcome, but in a few words wished the deputation to convey his thanks to the Council and citizens. Mr. Rae was Lieutenant in the 34th Battalion, and his father was the late surgeon.
