

WADY GOVERNMENT SUEBUBS

Long List of Charges to Be Faced by David Wells, Who Sold a "Wireless" Telephone.

placed. That night he is charged with

taking brass frames from the Mimico

Electric Building and breaking open a

Tramway's motor box, from which

he is charged with taking 20 cents. Some
