**CATARACT ALDERMEN WANT CONTRACT DRAWN**

In Absence of Ald. Hennessy Proposal to Appoint Committee is Voted Down.

HAMILTON, July 7.—(Special.)—There was another red-hot session of the city council this evening on the power question. The Cataract aldermen did not attempt to reach a formal contract with the company, but contented themselves with introducing a motion that an expert be engaged to assist the special power committee to draw up the terms of the contract with the company.

Ald. McLaren and Farmer moved, in amendment, that the expert be instructed to report on both the offer of the company and that of the hydro-electric commission. The Cataract aldermen voted the amendment down by majority of one, the division being 10 to 11.

The division was: Yeas—Mayor Stewart and Ald. Howard, A. J. Wright, Nicholson, Jutten, Gardner, McLaren, Farmer, Bailey and Anderson. Nays—Ald. Creaser, Clark, Dickson, Lewis, H. G. Wright, Pennington, Evans, Sweeney, Guy, Allan and Farrar. Had. Ald. Hennessy been present it would have been a tie vote. He is away on a vacation and telephoned the mayor that he would be on hand to vote for the people if it were necessary.

The mayor says he called up Ald. Sweeney, who promised that no advantage would be taken of Ald. Hennessy's absence, and the mayor accordingly told Ald. Hennessy that it would be safe for him to remain away. Ald. Sweeney denied that he had promised not to introduce a resolution limiting the report of the expert to the offer of the Cataract Company, but admitted that he had promised that no attempt would be made to put a contract thru. Ald. Sweeney's motion was carried on the same division with the exception that Ald. How did not vote from routine. That means that the expert was instructed to report only on the offer of the company and that a contract ready for the next meeting of the council.

**Council Chamber Packed.**

The council chamber was filled to the point of overflowing. The Cataract sympathizers were outnumbered by those of the hydro-electric commission. Ald. Clark and Sweeney should get up and state their positions, and the gathering was so full that the speaker giving vent to his indignation at the conduct of the Cataract aldermen. Mayor Stewart told Ald. H. G. Wright that he was sure the Cataract aldermen that he would vote for signing a contract with the company if the hydro-electric commission offered power for nothing.

**MUCH STILL REMAINS BEFORE SESSION ENDS**

Premier Lists Work Still Before House—All Are Ready Except Railway Subsidies Bill.

OTTAWA, July 7.—(Special.)—This morning the premier made his promised statement as to business to be introduced at this session of parliament. It includes:

1. Supplementary estimates.
2. Railway subsidies.
3. A bill regarding Quebec Bridge.
4. Legislation necessitated by the creation of new courts in Northern Ontario.
5. Legislation for the extension of the boundaries of Manitoba, Quebec, and Ontario.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier said that these were all ready for presentation to the house, with the exception of the railway subsidies bill. It was intimated that the government would proceed tomorrow with the resolution which pledges the financial support of the Dominion toward the All-Red line project.

**Railway and Canal Estimates.**

After dispatching of Hon. J. P. O'Leary's civil service reform bill at this afternoon session, an amendment being inserted forbidding civil servants to engage in political campaigns, the session went into supply on the railways and canal estimates.

Mr. Bennett observed that with a public debt of \$300,000,000 and an expenditure approaching \$150,000,000 a year, and all kinds of expensive schemes pending, it came to him, wondering how the government was going to get through the session. "Whether are we drifting?" This Port Colborne scheme had cost already three and a half millions and there were promised expenditures of a hundred millions for the Georgian Bay Canal and some six million for deepening the Welland.

**Should Have Expert Report.**

Mr. Kemp also supported the scheme of deepening the Welland, but he agreed with Mr. Bennett that the present routes should be allowed to develop.




Illustration of a large steamship or ocean liner.
