

Hazen said that assuming the Tribune cut was out \$2,000,000 under present conditions, there would be about 100,000 trees left in the woods, not only waste but a menace to the country on account of the danger to the country from fire. When the roads were all swamped and trees cut down these trees could be very cheaply brought out and they would make about \$200,000 worth of paper which would be largely paid out in wages. Some of the large lumber operators have decided they would remove their mills, even if they did not cut the country mill, but they would not cut the trees if they were manufactured by some one else.

The committee then retired to consider the bill in private and after some discussion the committee requested Mr. Powell to draft a new bill and present it for their consideration on Tuesday evening next at 8:30 p. m.
