#### THEY GOT THE MONEY.

CHICAGO, Oct. 16.—The White Sox, lords of the sun, moon, and stars, and rulers of the universe, were as busy counting their post-season prize money this morning as they had been in making base hits off Brown and Overall Sunday. All of the new world's champions appeared bright and early at President Comiskey's office to receive their several checks for \$1,572.

The National Commission yesterday turned over to Manager Jones of the Sox \$25,000, the team's share. That handsome sum was pooled with the \$15,000 presented to the Sox by President Comiskey and checked out in equal shares to the players.

Manager Jones, President Comiskey and each of the players have received almost a wagon load of congratulatory telegrams. They came from every part of the country and many from other countries. Of course, the greatest number came to the owner of the club. The "Old Roman" couldn't read them as fast as they arrived.

The victorious players last evening attended Roper's Theatre as the guests of Robert Edison, the actor. Mr. Edison also had the Cubs as his guests, and after the play both teams were banqueted at Roper's.

"Tiggs" Donohue has undertaken a barnstorming trip of about ten days' duration. Telegrams from a number of towns around the state were received yesterday asking for games.

The Cubs were not forgotten when the good things were being passed around. President Murphy gave each one of his nineteen players \$100 for meritorious work during the season, besides splitting the sum of \$2,774.40 taken in at exhibition games during the summer.

T. J. Loftis, once manager of the local National League team and later at the head of the Washington American League, gave one of the most intelligent resumés of the series. "The Cubs were thoroughly whipped before the Sunday game ever started," said Mr. Loftis. "Putting Brown into the box when he had pitched but two days before was an admission that the Cubs' hopes were hanging by a slender thread. And Brown got what I expected him to get. The Sox were full of confidence after the way they had slaughtered the Cub pitchers on the day before and I doubt if any pitcher in the business could have stopped them that day."

### IMPROVEMENT OF THE HARBOR

The sub-committee of the Board of Trade has had several meetings during the last three months at which different

steamers, schooner captains, pilots and others have given their opinions about better aids to navigation, so that the entrance of the St. John harbor and entrance to the Bay of Fundy will be made secure and safe for vessels.

This committee is about to prepare a report to the government in which they will consider the closing up of the western channel, the straightening of the eastern channel down to the island, additional light and buoys at entrance to bay and harbor, the cutting off of the point of the harbor bar, etc. As the committee does not wish to make this report until the public has had a chance to give their opinions about these matters, it has decided to hold an open session on Monday, October 22.

At this open session the public are invited to come and give their opinions upon the questions mentioned above. The Transportation Committee in its report unanimously favored the closing of the western channel, the deepening and widening of the main channel, and generally asked that the dominion government provide thorough and efficient aids to navigation at St. John. It seems wise to the committee that every person shall have a chance to express an opinion on these questions before the committee makes its final report.
